

# Soldiers of the Armée de Condé who joined the British Army in 1801

## Part 1 – Officers and men who joined the Chasseurs Britanniques Regiment

### Introduction

In April 1801 the Armée de Condé was disbanded in Styria as the War of the Second Coalition, last of the French Revolutionary Wars, drew to a close. Immediately, on 1 May 1801, the British, still fighting and in need of troops to reinforce their expedition to Egypt, formed a battalion strength regiment recruited from officers and men who had served in Condé's paid regiments. The first muster rolls and pay lists of the Chasseurs Britanniques thus provide a glimpse of those who had served in such regiments.

### Recruitment

The conventional wisdom is that the companies were formed by officers and men in the following fashion: two companies from the *Grenadiers de Bourbon* (those of Captains du Hautoy and de James), two companies from the *Régiment de Durand* (those of Captains d'Armolis and Schüller), a company from the *Dragons d'Enghien* (Captain de Serocourt) and a company made up from the French and Swiss *compagnies de la garde du quartier general* (Captain Le Page).

However the situation was somewhat more complex. The units of the Swiss Corps, which included non-Swiss, had also been disbanded in Styria and another new regiment, the Watteville Regiment, was expected to accept most of their soldiers who wished to enter British service. However, along with some local recruitment, a significant number from the Swiss units joined the Chasseurs Britanniques Regiment very soon after it was formed when the expectation of service in Naples failed to materialise. On the other hand a significant number of former Condéans, notably from *Durand*, joined the Watteville Regiment.

Furthermore, as can be seen in the below table, an additional, seventh, company was formed by soldiers drawn from the other companies.

### Losses

The table contains notes on the fates of many, if not most, of the soldiers. Immediately after formation the Chasseurs Britanniques were sent, via Malta, to join the British expedition in Egypt. There the soldiers were exposed to the natural risks of disease rather than those of conflict, for some leading to death or blindness (ophthalmia). The regiment then had a brief spell on Malta in late 1801 when several men took the opportunity to desert. In December 1801 the regiment returned to Egypt where it formed part of the garrison left there, until spring 1803, while peace negotiations continued between Britain and France. Again disease, including plague, took its toll.

During this period most of the foreign units in British service were disbanded and it was anticipated that the regiment would share the same fate once it returned from Egypt. Thus several soldiers took the offer to go to India to join British Army regiments there.

In early 1803 the regiment left Egypt and found that its services were to be retained as the peace was already breaking down. After a brief period of time in England and the Channel Islands it returned to Malta in the spring of 1804. Recruitment took place and so, with the gradual reduction in their numbers, the proportion of former Condéans in the regiment declined. However there was promotion for some, forming a core of NCOs that remained with the regiment throughout its service.

In 1805 deployment to Naples provided attractive opportunities for some soldiers to desert but, following the 1806 campaign in Calabria, the Chasseurs Britanniques received a substantial number of new recruits. A return to Egypt in 1807 saw further losses to the regiment including its first battlefield casualties, notably in and around Rosetta (Rašīd) in March.

Later, in Sicily the formation of a company of cavalry, the Foreign Mounted Riflemen or Hussars, from men of the foreign infantry units stationed there further reduced the number of old soldiers in the regiment. The Chasseurs Britanniques were sent to Spain in 1810 where they soon joined the army commanded by the Duke of Wellington. The regiment actively served in his campaigns until it was disbanded in 1814. Casualties from this period are also noted as are those soldiers who were invalided from service, the means by which they received a pension. Finally a few men continued to serve in other British regiments after 1815.

## **Names**

It should be recognised that many of the soldiers, who often could not write, had their names recorded by someone who did not speak their language. Even if the name was phonetically close, many variations could occur as it was written by the English paymaster or his sergeant from Alsace, perhaps from a list prepared by a Frenchman. In addition first names were often given not in the language of the holder, but that of the writer, so Ivan may appear as John or Jean. Soldiers' names could also change over time notably when they joined a British regiment when their name could be changed to a version more familiar to English speakers (e.g. Hakre/Hachre to Hawker/Hacker). Lastly it was common for a newly arrived soldier's name to appear in one form when recruited and in another in the next, and subsequent, lists.

Brown, Andrew

Born in Vienna, recruit on 29 May 1801, discharged 24 September 1807 then enlisted in the Royal West India Rangers, discharged 21 March 1820 with 'impaired vision' from ophthalmia.

Conrad, Mathew

Born in Düsseldorf, Germany, enlisted at formation and discharged in 1814 then enlisted in the 60<sup>th</sup> Foot the same year; discharged in 1822.

Delsey, John

Born in Burgundy, France enlisted at formation; transferred to the Foreign Invalids on 29 April 1811 discharged 12 February 1812 with urinary incontinence as a result of a wound.

Hougg, Louis

Recorded as being born at 'Burgshoven', Switzerland he served from formation until discharged with a pension on reduction on 8 August 1814, with a broken constitution through hard military service.

Laurent, John

Born in Flanders, he enlisted on formation aged 26 serving until discharged with a pension on reduction on 8 August 1814, worn out through service.
