### Soldiers of the Armée de Condé who joined the British Army in 1801

# Part 2 – Officers and men who joined the Watteville Regiment

When the Armée de Condé was disbanded in 1801, in modern-day Slovenia, a number of its former soldiers joined the Watteville Regiment instead of the Chasseurs Britanniques – see Part 1. The former regiment was largely, but not completely, recruited from the former soldiers of the Swiss Corps which had served alongside the Austrians, but paid for by Britain, in the War of the Second Coalition (the last of the French Revolutionary Wars). Local recruiting took place, including amongst disbanded soldiers who had second thoughts about leaving service, and also Captain Charles de Villatte brought to the regiment a company of soldiers from his former, *Durand*, regiment of the Armée de Condé. This company was complete, both in terms of numbers and proportion of ranks.

#### Service and losses

The Watteville Regiment's early service matched that of the Chasseurs Britanniques (see Part 1) so the soldiers faced the same risks to their lives and reasons, or opportunities, to leave their regiment. However, it remained on Malta in 1804, rather than sailing for Britain, before serving in Naples in 1805 and then going onto Sicily. The regiment fought at the Battle of Maida (4 July 1806) and received many new recruits from the prisoners taken in the campaign.

The regiment did not participate in the 1807 Egyptian expedition but left for Gibraltar in October 1807; the stay there was brief, returning to Sicily six months later. The Watteville Regiment went to Spain in 1811 where it joined the British contingent at Cádiz and supplied a detachment to garrison Cartagena. In 1813 it sailed to Canada to reinforce the British forces fighting the United States of America; it saw active service at Prescott (1813), Oswego and Fort Erie (1814) suffering considerable loss at the latter.

The regiment was finally disbanded in England on 24 October 1816, although quite a few men, and some officers, had been discharged in Canada. There they received parcels of land to clear for agricultural use and establish their homes, notably at Rideau Settlement (now Perth, Ontario).

Pay List and Muster Roll for 25 May to 24 June, and 25 June to 24 July, 1801 are from The National Archives, United Kingdom (TNA) reference WO 12/12018.

The notes for the soldiers have been collected from TNA series WO 12, 25, 97 and 121. The extensive records, in the 25 series, of the Watteville Regiment allow, in general, a fuller picture of the

background, service and fate of each of the former Condéans, in Villatte's company, than can be provided than for those in the Chasseurs Britanniques.

The notes for the officers have been collected from the published Army Lists (UK) and the following series: TNA series WO 12, 25, and PMG 6; Le Service Historique de Défense, France (SHD) 1KY and 3YE; the Archives du château de Chantilly, France 1 GR 078 and 143 and the Hampshire Record Office (UK) Wickham Papers 38M49.
